Equity Educator Certificate of Competency

A Certificate of Competency and a transcript for 18 Continuing Education Units (4.5 CEUs per course) will be issued by the USC Rossier School of Education to participants who complete all four online courses successfully, including the Mid-course Application Project and Capstone Project.

Equity Educator Continuing Education Transcript

A transcript for 3 CEUs will be issued by the USC Rossier School of Education to participants for each online course that they com-plete. Participants are not required to complete the Midcourse Application Project and Capstone Project to earn CEU credit alone.

The Need for the Equity Educator Certificate Program

Without knowing anything else about a student except his skin color and English language proficiency, you can predict his future. Will he take AP courses or be placed in Special Education? Will he be suspended from school? Will he be taught by inexperienced or unlicensed teachers? How likely is he to graduate from high school? Data from the U.S. Department of Education Office for Civil Rights shows the significant need for equality in education:

Black students are just 18% of all preschoolers.

they are 48% of all preschoolers with more than one out-of-school suspension¹
